It took the four of us to get everything in place to start the spring hunting season on the 1st of May. We also flew into Nanika Lake to work on the Lodge and give it a new paint job and repair the damage the Black Bear made in November of 1999. There was a lot of yard work done around the base, there sure needs to be more. Leah is putting pressure on me to have the old house removed and a new shop built. I am aiming to start in 2001.
